- PIs were encouraged to review previous NSF awards, both to identify successful
 potential mentors at one's university, and also in order to see what research is in
 progress that may not have yet made it to publication.

- Sending a one-page summary of a proposal before submitting it, generally, and
 especially if a PI is unsure of where whether the proposal is a good fit for a certain
 solicitation, was strongly encouraged; PIs can send these to the cluster emails in the
 next bullet.
- How NSF program directors choose panelists to review proposals was also discussed. If a
 researcher is interested in becoming a panelist, they should email the relevant program
 cluster to inform them of their interest, with a copy of their CV attached.
