SUBJECT: Division of Social and Economic Sciences COV: Diversity and Conflicts of Interest

The Committee of Visitors for the SBE Division of Social and Economic Sciences (SES) met on May 24-26, 2021, and the COV report and SBE response were approved by the SBE Advisory Committee on December 2, 2021. The COV consisted of 23 members selected for their expertise related to the goals of the SES programs under review. They provided a balance with respect to the type of institutions supported by the programs, gender, and representation from underrepresented group (breakdown shown below).
