

## REVISION OF THE NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION (NSF) GRANT GENERAL CONDITIONS (GC-1)

EFFECTIVE May 20, 2024

Effective May 20, 2024, new NSF awards and funding amendments to existing NSF awards made to for-profit organizations (other than Small Business Innovation Research/Small Business Technology Transfer awardees) and State, local or Tribal governments, will begin referencing and are subject to the *Grant General Conditions* (GC-1) dated 05/20/24<sup>1</sup>. The GC-1 will not be applied to NSF cooperative agreements or to NSF fellowship awards made to individuals.

## **Summary of Changes**

## **Overall Document**

- Editorial changes have been made throughout to either clarify or enhance the intended meaning of a sentence or section.
- Website and document references have been updated to reflect current information.
- Updates have been made to ensure consistency with guidance and terminology contained in other NSF or Federal policy documents.
- Article numbering has been updated to reflect the addition of several new articles.

## **By-Article Changes**

- Project Reporting Requirements, Article 15. This article has been supplemented with certification requirements provided by the PI or co-PI in annual and final annual project reports, including an annual certification that each postdoctoral scholar and graduate student who receives substantial NSF support must have an individual development plan.
- Safe and Inclusive Working Environments for Off-Campus or Off-Site Research, Article 19. This article has been supplemented with language to address postaward requirements associated with the plan for safe and inclusive working environments.
- Publications, Article 28. The guidance in this article has been updated to align with the NSF Policy on Brand Standards and the NSF Brand Standards Manual.
- Notification Requirements Regarding Sexual Harassment, Other Forms of Harassment, or Sexual Assault, Article 49. Updates were made to this article to improve clarity of language and NSF's expectations.
- Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program Certification, Article 51. This new article addresses Section 10632 of the CHIPS and Science Act of 2022 (42 U.S.C. § 19232). Each PI and co-PI identified on a proposal submitted or due on or after May 20, 2024, that results in an award, must certify annually in Research.gov, for the duration of the award that such individual is not a party to a malign foreign talent recruitment program. These certifications do not apply retroactively to proposals submitted prior to May 20, 2024.
- Postaward Additions of Postdoctoral Scholars or Graduate Students, Article 52. Requirements associated with postaward additions of postdoctoral scholars or graduate students are addressed in this new article.
- Individual Development Plans for Postdoctoral Scholars and Graduate Students, Article 53. This new article implements the Section 10313 (42 U.S.C. § 18993) of the CHIPS and Science Act of 2022 requirement that each postdoctoral scholar and graduate student who receives substantial NSF support must have an individual development plan.
